## **Amazing Brains Study Skills Workshop**

On Tuesday 20th November we will host the Amazing Brains study workshop in the Centenary Building. We have been hosting this event for over 4 years and try to change the format each year. This year, we are running this for our R11 and R13 pupils and they should bring along the following to this event:

- A specification (syllabus) of their choice (must be correct exam board i.e CCEA, Edexcel, AQA).
- Class notes and textbook for that subject

Through guided instruction the Amazing Brains presenter will steer students through the specification - identifying units, topics, sub-topics and key language, and will endeavour to enable students to interrogate the syllabus in order to make it more accessible.

There will be a charge of £23 per pupil for this event which will be put on your bill. We hope all of our pupils find this valuable in preparation for their mock exams in the next few weeks.

R9-R12: Art Studio


There will be no supper option available that evening due to the Thanksgiving Dinner which is pre-paid ticket access. Boarders will be attending this event.
